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#### Message from the ACCME President and CEO

#### **Growth and Progress**

The data in this report reflect a growing accredited continuing education (CE) system. The data shows that our community of accredited providers have reacted nimbly to the COVID-19 pandemic, redesigning learning environments to offer critically needed skills and support to healthcare professionals and teams, and evolving their approach to meeting learners' needs in a variety of new ways. In 2021, our community continued to innovate and persevere, and the number of educational events offered resumed its upward trajectory. I encourage you to leverage the data in this report to identify long-range trends and develop educational programs to meet the needs of your community.



Our new, improved Program and Activity Reporting System (PARS) launched in November 2021. It now includes expanded options for reporting activity and learner credit data. Some of the changes in data fields establish 2021 as a new baseline for comparisons moving forward. For instance, rather than reporting the number of hours of instruction provided, beginning in 2021 we are reporting AMA PRA Category 1 Credits<sup>™</sup> offered. Also, the types of activities were modified to reflect the ease with which learners now engage remotely in both live and enduring material activities. We no longer draw the distinction between live and enduring activities that are provided in person and via the Internet. We are grateful to our accredited providers for embracing this upgraded system and adapting to the streamlined reporting requirements.

ACCME will continue to expand its capabilities in tracking and managing information about accredited educational providers, their activities, and the learners who complete them. We are sharing data with an increasing number of certifying and licensing boards to increase the value of accredited CE, ensure that clinicians can find specific activities that meet their needs (using CMEpassport.org), and reduce the burden of managing this information on all stakeholders. As more accredited providers proactively add their upcoming activities to PARS and report all of their learner data for all of their activities we will be able to uncover the increasing value of an integrated delivery and management system for CME and a performance management system for healthcare organizations and their clinicians.

My ACCME colleagues and I remain inspired by the hard work and dedication of our accredited providers—you have continuously evolved to meet the changing needs of your learners, innovating to deliver much-needed education during a time of uncertainty. Health professionals' education is among the most powerful currencies for change in the healthcare ecosystem. Your contributions make this change possible. Thank you.

#### **Onward and Upward: Thriving Together in Accredited Continuing Education – 2021**

#### **Executive Summary**

Each year, accredited providers within the Accreditation Council for Continuing Medical Education (ACCME<sup>®</sup>) System submit data describing their accredited education activities and overall education programs. The ACCME aggregates this information to give a view of the year as well as long-range trends. The aggregated information is available for audit by ACCME per requirements. The ACCME does not provide full verification of the accuracy of all reported information but does follow-up on outliers or major changes from previous years. We also investigate if it appears that providers have reported activity data that does not conform to the ACCME's definitions and reporting instructions. The 2021 Data Report marks the 24th year we have published this report as a service to our accredited education community and other healthcare stakeholders. #### **Key Takeaways**

- The number of accredited educational activities increased by 19%, from 172,000 in 2020 to 204,000 in 2021, representing the work of approximately 1,668 accredited providers.
- This education resulted in record levels of engagement from healthcare professionals. The number of physician interactions increased by 19% from 18 million in 2020 to nearly 22 million in 2021.
- Income reported by accredited providers rose by 25% over the past year from \$2.2 billion to \$2.8 billion, including increases in industry support for accredited education (\$772 million to \$895 million), registration fees (\$1.2 billion to 1.5 billion), and advertising and exhibits (\$219 million to \$367 million).
- Accredited organizations are reporting many more activities that observe and measure performance, and more activities that extend and demonstrate the impact of their training to patient and community outcomes.
- Joint Accreditation for Interprofessional Education<sup>™</sup> continues to grow in number of providers and professions represented, as demonstrated by the growth of other learners reflected in this report.
- The data represent a stable system of accredited providers, demonstrating continued growth in online learning and team-based learning.

#### About the CME Provider Community

The ACCME Data Report 2021 features information on 1,668 accredited education providers in the ACCME System. This includes:

- ACCME-accredited providers: Organizations that offer continuing medical education (CME) to primarily national or international audiences.
- State-accredited providers: Organizations that offer CME primarily to learners from their state or contiguous states. These providers are accredited by <u>ACCME Recognized</u> <u>Accreditors</u> (state and territory medical societies).
- Jointly accredited providers: Organizations that focus on continuing education by and for healthcare teams. These providers are accredited by <u>Joint Accreditation for</u> <u>Interprofessional Continuing Education</u>.

Accredited providers represent a range of organizations from large international institutions to small rural hospitals. Some specialize in local, community-based health issues, others focus on national and international health priorities, and others advance interprofessional continuing education (IPCE) and team-based care. The ACCME and Joint Accreditation accredit organizations within and outside the US, and this report includes data from providers located in other countries in addition to US provider data. The geographic distribution and diversity of accredited education providers means that physicians and teams have access to high-quality education where they live and work that addresses local, national, and international healthcare priorities.



#### CME Presented by Providers Accredited in the ACCME System Figure 1. Activities and Interactions 2005-2021 (Revised November 2022)

The accredited CME system saw a number of changes in 2020 due to the impact of COVID-19. While the number of activities decreased in 2020 due to cancelled live activities, physician and other learner interactions both saw increases. In 2021, activities, physician interactions, and other learner interactions all increased.

The breaks in the line for other learner interactions in 2018 indicates a change in data collection. In 2018, the launch of the Joint Accreditation Program and Activity Reporting System (JA-PARS) enabled jointly accredited providers to report program and activity data, including uni-professional and interprofessional continuing education (IPCE) activities, into a single, unified repository. This change accounts for the increase in other learner interactions between 2017 and 2018.




#### CME Presented by Providers Accredited in the ACCME System Figure 2. Total Income—2021 Total income is \$2,812,073,839

In 2021, the majority of CME activities (93%) did not receive commercial support, accounting for 90% of physician interactions, and 93% of other learner interactions. Seven percent of CME activities received commercial support, accounting for 10% of physician interactions and 7% of other learner interactions.

In 2021, the total income from CME presented by providers accredited in the ACCME System was \$2,812,073,839.

Registration fees comprised 52% of the total income in 2021 (\$1,472,168,645). Of this amount, the majority of income was generated by publishing/education companies, followed by nonprofits (physician membership organization), schools of medicine, nonprofits (other), other providers, and hospital/healthcare delivery systems.

Commercial support comprised 32% of the total income in 2021 (\$895,031,740). Of this amount, the majority of income was generated by publishing/education companies, followed by schools of medicine, nonprofits (physician membership organizations), hospital/healthcare delivery systems, insurance companies/managed care companies, and other providers.

Advertising and exhibits income comprised 13% of the total income in 2021 (\$367,537,237). Of this amount, the majority of income was generated by nonprofits (physician membership organizations), followed by publishing/ education companies, schools of medicine, hospital/healthcare delivery systems, nonprofits (other), and other providers.

Government grants comprised 2% of the total income in 2021 (\$52,989,702). Of this amount, the majority of income was generated by nonprofits (physician membership organizations), schools of medicine, nonprofits (other), hospital/ healthcare delivery systems, publishing/education companies, other providers, and government or military organizations.

Private donations comprised 1% of the total income in 2021 (\$24,346,525). Of this amount, the majority of income was generated by nonprofits (physician membership organizations), followed by nonprofits (other), schools of medicine, publishing/education companies, hospital/healthcare delivery systems, and other providers.
